Clothing

Much of the site is outdoors, so please ask parents to prepare children for hot, cold or wet weather. Paths are tarmac but in very wet weather there can be mud or puddles in some areas, so suitable footwear is important.

Lunch

Children should bring their own packed lunch which is taken in our outdoor picnic areas. Unless the school permits it, we do not normally allow the children to buy sweets and drinks. All rubbish generated by your school must be taken away with you.

Our British wildlife-themed gift shop offers many pocket-money items suitable for children. Let us know if you wish to visit the shop during your visit or we can provide a gift selection for each child to suit your set budget.

Animal Encounters

Our 'Animal Encounters' programme is run for organised school groups from Reception to Year 7. It complements and brings to life teaching in the classroom on a variety of National Curriculum topics and skills in Science, Geography and History at Key Stages 1, 2 and 3.

A visit here will encourage a greater awareness of the natural world, show how we fit into it and emphasise the need to care for the environment and its sustainability. This is a chance to see many fascinating British animals and birds including otters, foxes, wildcats, and owls. The children will learn about wildlife habitats, the countryside and the survival challenges faced by wildlife in Britain today.





Visit schedule

Tours are led by our team of keepers and take place in and around the animal enclosures. With a break for lunch and a visit to the gift shop (optional), the day ends at 2pm.

Typical School Visit Schedule:

The tour sessions may take place in a different order, depending on pupil numbers

- 10.00 Arrival and introductions
- 10.15 Session 1: Barn & Hedgerow: (indoors) rats, owls, hedgehogs & small mammals
- 11.00 Break
- 11.15 Session 2: (outside) foxes, Scottish wildcats, red squirrels and badgers
- **12.15** Lunch (and gift shop if required)
- 1.00 Session 3: (outside) owls, otters, deer and nature reserve boardwalk
- **2.00** Departure





When to visit

Visits are available during term time all year round, and whenever you come we will be closed to the public.

The summer term is especially popular and we usually fill all dates in May, June and early July, so please book early for this period. However, there is much to see at other times of the year.
